Rural Representatives Organize for 2003 Session House Bush Caucus Elects Kapsner

JUNEAU – With a focus on the economy, education and rural power rates, a bipartisan group of seven legislators have organized for the 2003 Alaska Legislature. The House Bush Caucus elected Rep. Mary Kapsner of Bethel to chair the group.

"We stand a good chance of achieving our goals for rural Alaska by standing together," Rep. Kapsner (D-Bethel) said. "It's an honor to serve in this important position."

During an initial meeting on January 27th, the House Bush Caucus discussed the need to create jobs for rural residents, secure adequate funding for the Power Cost Equalization (PCE) program and for education at all levels.

"With a new administration and many new faces in the Legislature, the House Bush Caucus can bring rural Alaska's needs to the forefront. I believe the priorities we have identified for this year are basic needs shared by many communities across the state," said Rep. Reggie Joule (D-Kotzebue), the immediate past caucus chair.

In addition to Kapsner and Joule, the caucus includes by Rep. Richard Foster (D-Nome); Rep. Albert Kookesh (D-Angoon); Rep. Carl Morgan (R-Aniak); Rep. Carl Moses (D-Unalaska); and Rep. Bill Williams (R-Saxman).
