At the request of Senator Davis, a full presentation proposal packet was prepared by Anchorage Convention & Visitors Bureau (ACVB) Convention Sales Manager, Julie Dodds, and sent to Director of Energy Policy, Rodney Charley. The materials, supported strongly by Senator Davis, convinced the Director that Anchorage should be the next site for the groups meeting. Charley participated in the 2003 Iditarod Fam this March as part of a site inspection.

The National Black Caucus of State Legislators' (NBCSL) primary mission is to develop, conduct and promote educational, research and training programs designed to enhance the effectiveness of its members, as they consider legislation and issues of public policy which impact, either directly or indirectly upon "the general welfare" of African American constituents within their respective jurisdictions.
