HB 47 – Restorative Community Justice

One of the most vital functions of our criminal justice system is apprehending first-time offenders and reforming them before they develop into career criminals. Restorative Community Justice represents a proven method that steers errant members of society into productive and law abiding lives. The guiding principles and values of Restorative Community Justice are as follows:

- 1. Crime is an offense against human relationships.
- 2. Victims and the community are central to justice processes.
- 3. The first priority of justice is to assist victims.
- 4. The second priority is to restore the community, to the degree possible.
- 5. The offender has personal responsibility to victims and to the community for crimes committed.
- 6. Stakeholders share responsibilities for restorative justice through partnerships for action.
- 7. The offender will develop improved competency and understanding as a result of the restorative justice experience.

House Bill 47 directs the Department of Corrections to study the principles of Restorative Community Justice and produce a plan for implementing these principles in Alaska.
