## **A RESOLUTION**

1 Relating to children's environmental health.

# 2 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

- WHEREAS the President of the United States and the United States Environmental
- 4 Protection Agency have placed an emphasis on protecting children's environmental health;
- 5 and
- WHEREAS children are more vulnerable to substances in the environment because
- 7 they breathe more air, drink more fluids, and eat more food in proportion to body weight than
- 8 adults: and
- 9 WHEREAS children's small size, high metabolism, and close proximity to ground-
- 10 level make our youngest Alaskans the most vulnerable of our citizens to environmental toxins
- and other dangers; and
- WHEREAS good health early in life is crucial to good health throughout life, and the
- state will realize great financial benefit through the improved health of its citizenry; and
- 14 WHEREAS four percent of children under six years of age have dangerously high
- 15 levels of lead in their blood leading to intelligence quotient deficits, learning disabilities,
- behavioral problems, and nervous system disorders; and

WHEREAS 5,000,000 children and adolescents suffer from asthma, which is the
leading chronic illness in children and which causes 10,000,000 missed days of school a year
nationwide; children absorb greater concentrations of smoke and other air pollutants than do
adults, further aggravating the asthma symptoms of an estimated 1,000,000 children;
BE IT RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature recognizes Alaska's children as
our most important resource, whose health must be protected; and be it
FURTHER RESOLVED that the legislature intends to continue its support for
smoking cessation programs and encourages schools to help minimize asthma triggers
through improving the air quality in school facilities; and be it
FURTHER RESOLVED that the legislature supports the use of nontoxic products,
the use of integrated pest management practices, and the protection of children from products
dangerous to them; and be it
FURTHER RESOLVED that the legislature will seek ways to promote protection of
children from environmental harm through partnerships in business, voluntary organizations,
and programs to teach safer habits to children and their parents.
